



APPOINTMENT LETTER

This letter confirms that **Cristina Blaya Góngora** from Spain has been appointed as **Scientix Ambassador** from 1 July 2023 until 31 December 2024.

Scientix is the largest community for science education in Europe. It started in 2010 as an initiative funded by the European Commission which promotes and supports a Europe-wide collaboration among teachers, education researchers, policymakers, and other education professionals to promote the importance of STEM (science, technology, engineering, and maths) in education and our lives. From the beginning, Scientix has been coordinated by European Schoolnet (EUN), a Brussels-based non-profit organisation of 34 Ministries of Education, which has been driving innovation in teaching and learning, and fostering pan-European collaboration of schools and teachers since its inception. From April 2023, Scientix continues as an initiative of EUN, supported by Ministries of Education, STEM Alliance Industry partners, Scientix Associate Partners, and in collaboration with different European Commission funded projects.

Scientix Ambassadors do not represent Scientix or EUN but support the dissemination of Scientix and the exchange of practices and knowledge between all STEM education stakeholders. Scientix Ambassadors help share STEM activities at national level and play an active role in supporting innovation in STEM education in their countries. They present innovative STEM practices in schools and national teachers associations, on conferences and workshops, and can advise teachers how to get involved in European collaboration in STEM. They also assist in developing and testing various tools and activities through the Scientix projects support services.
